



VIGILANCE VALEDICTORY FUNCTION HELD ON 05TH NOVEMBER 2011

The valedictory function in connection with the celebration of the “Vigilance Awareness Week 2011” was held at Conference Hall, Corporate Headquarters, DCI, Visakhapatnam this afternoon. The Police Commissioner Mr. J. Purnachandra Rao, IPS attended the same as Chief Guest. Mr. P. Murali Mohan, IPS, Chief Vigilance Officer, Visakhapatnam Port Trust and Mr. B. Suresh Krishna, IAS, Chief Vigilance Officer, Hindustan Shipyard Limited were invited as Guests of honour. Welcoming the gathering Mr. S. Vasudeva Rao, IPS, Chief Vigilance Officer, DCI has referred to the changed environment in regard to accountability of public sector undertakings. Various stakeholders like citizen activists, media, judiciary and NGOs have been playing an increasingly assertive role in monitoring issues of governance. The PSUs, he said, are required to realize their custodial responsibilities and contribute more effectively and efficiently to economic development of the country.

The Commissioner of Police Shri J. Purnachandra Rao, IPS in his address stressed the need for employees to be better aware of vigilance imperatives and discharge their duties in a sincere and honest manner. Instead of being too self-oriented, employees have to introspect more and contribute to the well-being of society. Commitment and passion for excellence should characterize their work. By continuous focus on one’s work, mistakes can be gradually reduced and better productivity can be ensured.

Mr. P. Murali Mohan, IPS, CVO, VPT in his address has underlined the importance of self-governance and being true to one’s conscience in one’s discharge of official responsibilities. Emphasizing that man’s basic needs are simple, he said one must be content with what one has and not do immoral and greedy acts as the same will recoil in long term.

Mr. B. Suresh Krishna, IAS, CVO, HSL has appealed to the employees to do continuous self-introspection and improve one’s performance and conduct. He also laid emphasis on the importance of the transparency and fairness in managerial processes.

Commodore P. Jayapal, Director (Ops & Tech), DCI has presided. In his address, he stated that though vigilance is a bitter medicine, it has to be accepted as an essential and inseparable part of management that contributes to enhancement of standards of productivity and probity. He called upon senior executives to focus more closely on preventive vigilance aspects of vigilance administration as the same will help in reduction of unwarranted costs in future.
